CASCADE PUTTING COURSE

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION

Students test their golfing skills at the Cascade Putting Course. The course offers bunkers and water hazards just like a full-size course, but on a smaller scale. Situated at the base of the Niagara Escarpment, this 18-hole, par-67 putting course is landscaped with a limestone backdrop, waterfalls and inspiring features that highlight the beauty of the natural surroundings and panoramic views. This is a great activity for students to learn a new sport, as well as apply skills and strategies in a target game.

TEACHING NOTES

BEFORE YOU GO

Learning Goal

Students learn how to send an object to a target in the context of a target game.

Minds On Activity

- → Provide students with a wide variety of manipulation tools such as floor hockey sticks, pool noodles, tennis racquets, scoops, golf putter, etc.
- → Individually, or with a partner, have the students select a manipulation tool and ball to experiment with and practice the following: moving with the object, changing directions receiving an object, and sending an object.
- → Debrief Questions for students:
 - Describe how you would choose to send the object and why?
 - What makes you successful in controlling the object when performing a variety of skills?
 - Which object would you choose to send to a target and why?

Action Activity

- → Organize the target objects from the Materials List into a variety of station challenges this can be can be done by the teacher or co-constructed with students. Each station should have one manipulation tool, one target and one object that can be used to hit a target. Sample stations may include the following activities:
 - Underhand serve a badminton bird into a hula hoop.
 - · Shoot a tennis ball into the net using a floor hockey stick.
 - Putt a whiffle ball at a pylon.
- → Students will rotate from station to station to practice the skills associated with sending objects to a stationary target. Students should stand 5 large steps away from the target when sending objects.

Accommodations/Modifications

- → Change the distance from the target from 5 steps to 10 steps what changes for the sender?
- \rightarrow Create a point system and have the students keep score of their success.

WHILE YOU ARE THERE

At Blue Mountain Resort

→ At the Cascade Putting Course, students will practice the skills and strategies learned from the target games they created in their pre-trip activity.

ONCE YOU GET BACK

Consolidation Activity

- → Arrange the students into small groups, allow each group 15 minutes to discuss the following questions. Then record their responses on chart paper.
 - What skills are similar in any type of sending activity involving a manipulation tool?
 - What strategies were similar in all target activities to achieve success?
 - Explain how you used skills and knowledge from the class activities to make you successful at the Cascade Putting Course?
